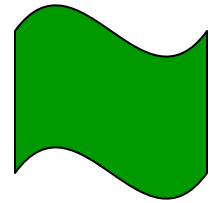


## FLAGS AND THEIR MEANINGS

Flags are used to provide information for the drivers regarding the course conditions in a particular sector or to summon them into the pits because of potential mechanical problems or rule infractions.

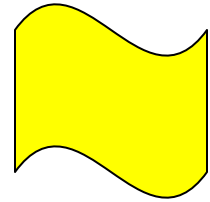
### GREEN FLAG (Solid Green)

- A race is under way. This flag shall normally be in the possession of the Starter only.
- When displayed, the green flag indicates that the course is clear.



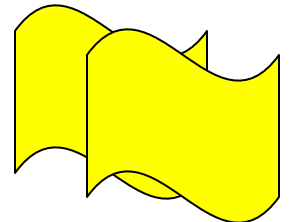
### YELLOW FLAG (Solid Yellow)

- Take care, Danger, Slow Down.
- NO PASSING FROM THE FLAG until past emergency area.



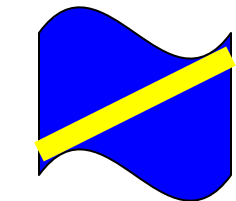
### YELLOW FLAG (Waving Solid Yellow)

- Great Danger, Slow Down, be prepared to stop
- NO PASSING FROM THE FLAG until past emergency area.



### DOUBLE YELLOW (Double Yellow, Displayed at All Stations)

- Entire course is under full course yellow. All stations will display Double yellow flags for all pace and safety car laps.
- SLOW DOWN, NO PASSING. However, cars may carefully pass emergency vehicles and other cars that are disabled or off pace.

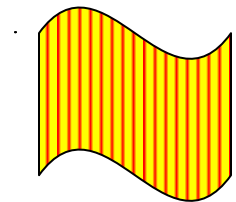


### BLUE FLAG (Blue with Diagonal Yellow Stripe)

- Passing Flag – Another competitor is following you very closely or is trying to overtake you.
- Flag may be displayed standing or waving, depending upon the speed with which you are being overtaken.

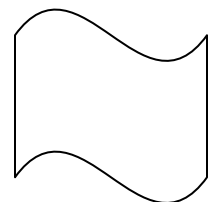
### YELLOW FLAG (Yellow with vertical red strips)

- Take Care.
- Oil or debris on track creating a slippery condition.
- Slow car down.



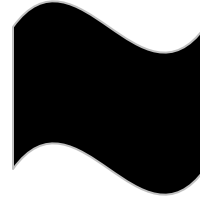
### WHITE FLAG (Solid White)

- Slow moving or emergency vehicle in your immediate area
- Take Care
- Flag will be shown standing for two stations prior to the vehicle.



BLACK FLAG (Solid Black)

- Finish your lap and then pull safety into the pits.
- Will be pointed at your car

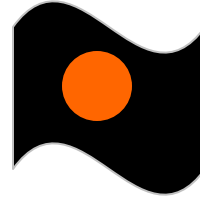


BLACK FLAG with the word “ALL”

- All cars proceed directly to the pits.

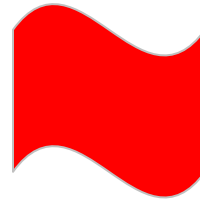
BLACK FLAG with ORANGE BALL

- Mechanical problems with your car
- Proceed to your pit at reduced speed



RED FLAG (Solid Red)

- Come to an immediate, controlled stop, but . don't endanger yourself or another car by the abruptness of your stop.
- Pull the car to the edge of the track
- **THE RACE HAS BEEN STOPPED.**



CHECKERED FLAG (black and white checks)

- You have finished the race or practice session.
- Continue cautiously to the pits.
